PALMYRA TOWNSHIP - WAYNE COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 06 - 01

WHEREAS, Palmyra Township, by and through its Board of Supervisors, adopted on June 6, 1992, by Ordinance No. 92-3 an Ordinance Regulating Solicitors, Peddlers, Hawkers, Itinerant Merchants or Transient Vendors of Merchandise in Palmyra Township; and

WHEREAS, Section 4 of the aforesaid Ordinance provides for permits, applicable fees and conditions for issuance; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors are desirous of amending Section 4 in order to cover the necessary cost and enactment provisions necessary for the general welfare of the Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved and enacted by the Board of Supervisors as follows:

1. Effect upon enactment of this Resolution, permits shall be issued on a thirty (30) day basis. The permit shall bear a fee of One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars upon issuance. Upon expiration of a permit for the thirty (30) day period, it will be necessary for the entity seeking to operate in accordance with Section 4, to renew the permit for an additional thirty (30) days.
2. Upon effective enactment of this Resolution, the party requesting a permit shall:
 - A. Provide proof of liability insurance to the Township in an amount not less than \$100,000.00 per individual and/or \$500,000.00 per occurrence.
 - B. Provide proof that the applicant will erect a port-a-potty or other similar device which will provide for the sanitary collection of waste.
 - C. Provide proof of a Highway Occupancy Permit issued by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the site the applicant intends to utilize.
3. All remaining terms and conditions of said Ordinance shall remain in effect.
